

## **RCSC Golf Advisory meeting info – 4/15/2021**

**1. Motion passed for a new local rule regarding greenside sprinkler heads. This “option” is effective immediately.**

**Relief will be granted with no penalty incurred based on the following conditions:**

- Sprinkler head must be within 2 club lengths of the putting surface**
- Ball must be within 2 club lengths behind the sprinkler head and the sprinkler head must be in the proposed line of play.**
- Ball must be in closely mown area and not in the rough**
- Relief may be taken “within” 2 club lengths of original ball position, no closer to the hole.**

**2. On March 25 the RCSC board did pass a motion to continue to allow up to 5 carts on regulation courses and up to 4 carts on executive courses through Oct 31. This motion will be revisited at that time.**

**3. The advisory board tabled a motion regarding the number of straight sheet courses per day “when things get back to normal” until the May meeting. It has been indicated that there might be more than one straight sheet each day, Thursdays thru Mondays. The straight sheets would be rotated on a monthly basis.**

**4. A motion was made and passed by golf advisory to “keep public green fees and cart fees the same as they are now. \$42 green fee and \$12 cart fee. The public takes up approximately 10% of our tee times. This includes guests and those calling for tee times within the 3 days allowed.**

**5. FYI – if you have heard any rumors about a RCSC golf course closing. The RCSC bylaw wording was explained to us. If one resident that lives on the course in question opposes the course closing, it will not be closed. So.....the chances of a golf course closing will be very slight.**

**6. Lakes West presented why they chose to use a red/yellow tee combination for their ladies league. It is mainly due to events that have gross scoring. Everyone needs to use the same tee box when there is a gross event.**
